

Peace memorial Ceremony Because of the involvement of Kuroshima in the war, a ceremony in honor of peace and the sacrifices made by those who fought is held on the island.

Hassaku odori / Bon odori

Those events are traditionally held all around Mishimamura. There is a variety of dances and atmoshperes depending on the communities.

Mishima Kikai Caldera Geopark

Mishimamura is Japan's smallest Geopark.

We can observe the link between the Earth activity, its ecosystem and our history including everyday life and culture while traveling through the Geopark. In Japan, there are presently 44 Geoparks (as of September 2018). Mishima village became one of them in September of 2015, joining the Japanese Geopark Network.

Remains of a large eruption from 7300 years ago.

"Kikai Caldera" is a crater that has been formed by the collapse of the former volcano, resulted from a huge eruption in the Jyomon era (7,300 years ago). The cliff seen on the picture to the right is an edge of this crater.

Japan has known many eruptions throughout its geographical history, powerful enough to form calderas over 10 km wide. This one is the most recent one, because of it, it is possible to see precise traces of it. Travel around Mishima, in order to feel the spectacular work of the Earth by witnessing the traces of this eruption, from 7,300 years ago.



Japan Aviation at 099





Mt. Iwo located on Iwojima is an active volcano. Volcanoes are dangerous, but it also provides gifts: sulfur. The sulfur from Iwojima was remarkably already mined a 1000 years ago in the prospect of using it in gunpowder, and was even exported to China. Until the closure of the mine in 1964, Iwojima was known as a famous production place of sulfur. Nowadays, Mishima Village refocused on the history of sulfur. We are now pushing for the use of Iwojima's sulfur in the making of fireworks. Learn about the volcano and the people living with it in a fun way. Camelia oil

There is plenty of camellia groves distributed on Iwojima which are used to make oil by pressing their seeds.



Mandarin Kuroshima

It is a wild mandarin from Kuroshima, it has a strong scent, once rippened it has a resfreshing and sightly sweet taste. Ōsato produces a widely popular Kuroshima mandarin flavoured chiffon cake.

Daimyō bamboo shoots

In the past, it was so prects and expensive (delicious) that only Daimyō (local lords) could eat it. It is so fresh that you can even eat it with sashimi. It is very good stewed or sautéed in butter but the best way to prepare it is baked, preferably in a barbecue.




Iwojima

Higashi onsen With its wild shore, thanks to a rocky and rugged beach, and a beautiful background composed by Mt. Iwo, and a gorgeous vividly colored sea, Higashi onsen is a very famous destination for every onsen fan.

Heike castle ruins The Heike Castle is said to have been built by the Taira Family after the Batle of Danno Ura in order to protect themselves from the Genji family.From here, we can see the Kaimon dake if the weather is good.

Statue of Syunkan

It is said that in 1177, after trying to overthrow the Heike family, he was banished to Iwojima accompanied by Yasuyori Taira and Naritsune Fujiwara.

The bell of Hope The bell of Happiness

Both of the bells are located on the Koibito Peninsula, also known as the lovers' peninsula. The Bell of Hope is in the middle of the peninsula near a bridge and the Bell of Happiness is at the very end of the path, they are great place to see the silouhelty of Yakushima, Kuchinoerabushima, and Tanegashima.

Mishima Djembé school Mishima Djembé school is the only one of its kind in the whole Asia. The students cime from everywhere to practice hard in the middle of the rich nature of lyoping Djembé Djembé is a traditional drum originaly from West Africa. It has been introduced to Mishima in 1994 by famous Guinean djembé player, since then, Mishima has been maintaining a relationship with the Republic of Guinea, by spreading the Inowledge of diembé.

Antoku Emperor's Tomb

It is said that he killed himself at Dannoura, but an other legend says that he lived a full life in Iwojima. This tomb is rumored to be his real one.

Kumano Shrine

This shrine has been established by Syunkan's two companions in order to pray to the same god as the one they were praying back in the capital.
